Peter Maniura is an award-winning TV producer and director with more than 30 years experience in music and arts broadcasting, formerly at the BBC and the EBU. He is Director of the IMZ Academy, leading courses which train content makers working in the performing arts. He is also a digital media consultant and guest lecturer. At the BBC he was Head of Television Classical Music and Performance from 1998 to 2012, and later Head of Digital Development for BBC Arts covering festivals and performances.

As a programme maker he directs and produces documentaries and live events, including 'Maestro', the prime-time conducting competition for BBC2 and Flash mob the Opera, live from Paddington Station, for the opening season of BBC 3. His programmes have won major awards, including a BAFTA and International Emmy in 2006 for 'Holocaust: A music memorial film from Auschwitz'. He is a Member of the Royal Victorian Order – an award in recognition of his work as Producer of 'Prom at the Palace,' which marked Queen Elizabeth II's Golden Jubilee."
